World, Texas and The Young And The Restless. Caryn starred as Gidget in the movie Gidget's Summer Reunion and the same role in the nationally broadcast series The New Gidget, which ran for 3 years. Following Gidget, Caryn starred as Dr. Jayne Johnson in Hollywood Safari, which ran for 2 seasons on Animal Planet. Other TV appearances include roles as Greg Brady's wife in the TV movie A Very Brady Christmas and appearing in Good Advice, Five, Malibu, Ca., Jake And The Fatman, Matlock, Mike Hammer, Hard Time On Planet Earth and Likely Suspects. Her film credits include Young Hollywood, Sleepstalker, The Hitman and Angel Fire. Caryn's theatre credits include Suds, Dottie, Blame It On The Movies, Till Death Or Whatever Do Us Part, Crcle Of Will, In A Yellow Wood, and Bye Bye Brooklyn with Tony Danza, True Story, I Remember You and Cannibals.



Richard Morgan Jones has spent his entire career working within the Entertainment Industry, holds a BA from the University of California, Santa Barbara and a Masters of Fine Arts in Theatre from the California Institute of the Arts (Cal Arts) in Valencia. He



appeared Off-Broadway, in regional theatre productions and daytime television, including the ABC drama Ryan's Hope. Following that, Richard moved behind the camera on HBO's Not Necessarily The News, The Wonder Years, Forrest Gump, Jerry Maguire, The Truman Show, and Fear and Loathing in Las Vegas. His sharp eye for detail and ability to locate realistic hard-to-find set dressing pieces was evident in his work on Ron Howard's Apollo 13, which received an Academy Award nomination for Best Art Direction and Best Set Decoration. He worked for 11 seasons on the Emmy Award winning Frasier, known for its memorable interior design featuring such iconic set pieces as Martin's beat-up green striped easy chair. He has been twice recognized by the Academy of Television Arts and Sciences for his contributions to Frasier.
